APEC Seven Principles of Supply Chain Resilience

- 1. Share information and knowledge to promote supply chain resilience.
- 2. Promote disaster risk management and hazard mapping to better understand potential risks to supply chain resilience.
- 3. Support planning and business continuity management to improve global supply chain resilience.
- 4. Promote best practice policy, regulations, and flexibility to enable global supply chain resilience.
- Leverage regional cooperation to support the supply chain, including coordination with other multinational organizations working on supply chain resilience inside and outside the APEC region.
- 6. Promote critical infrastructure protection and inter-modalism as a key component of supply chain resilience.
- 7. Recognize and promote best practice in human resource and capacity management in the context of supply chain resilience.



Five Year Plan (2013-2017)

- Each year, focus on one Principle for ALL the APEC Economies
- Each year, focus on one developing Economy regarding ALL Principles



Promote One Principle Each Year

- Best practices
- Intense workshop with multiple participants from each participating economy
- Cooperation between government, business, NGOs, international organizations
 - 2015 = Hazard & risk mapping of supply chains
 - Peru, May 4 6, 2015

2016 = Resilient Responders Bangkok, September 26 – 27



Resilient Responder Workshop

 - Individuals: public safety and emergency management

Focus on One Developing Economy Each Year

- Each year, develop an Action Plan for Supply Chain Resilience for one of the APEC economies
 - Establish a Steering Committee to work with APEC team to develop the workshop and encourage and guide follow-on activities
 - Involve partners (e.g. national & local governments, NGO's, USAID, companies)
 - Conduct a workshop
 - Facilitate discussions
 - Jointly develop an Action Plan
 - Implement the Action Plan
- 2015 = the Philippines
- 2016 = Vietnam: October 26 28

- One Developing Economy for focused effort and economy-specific workshop
