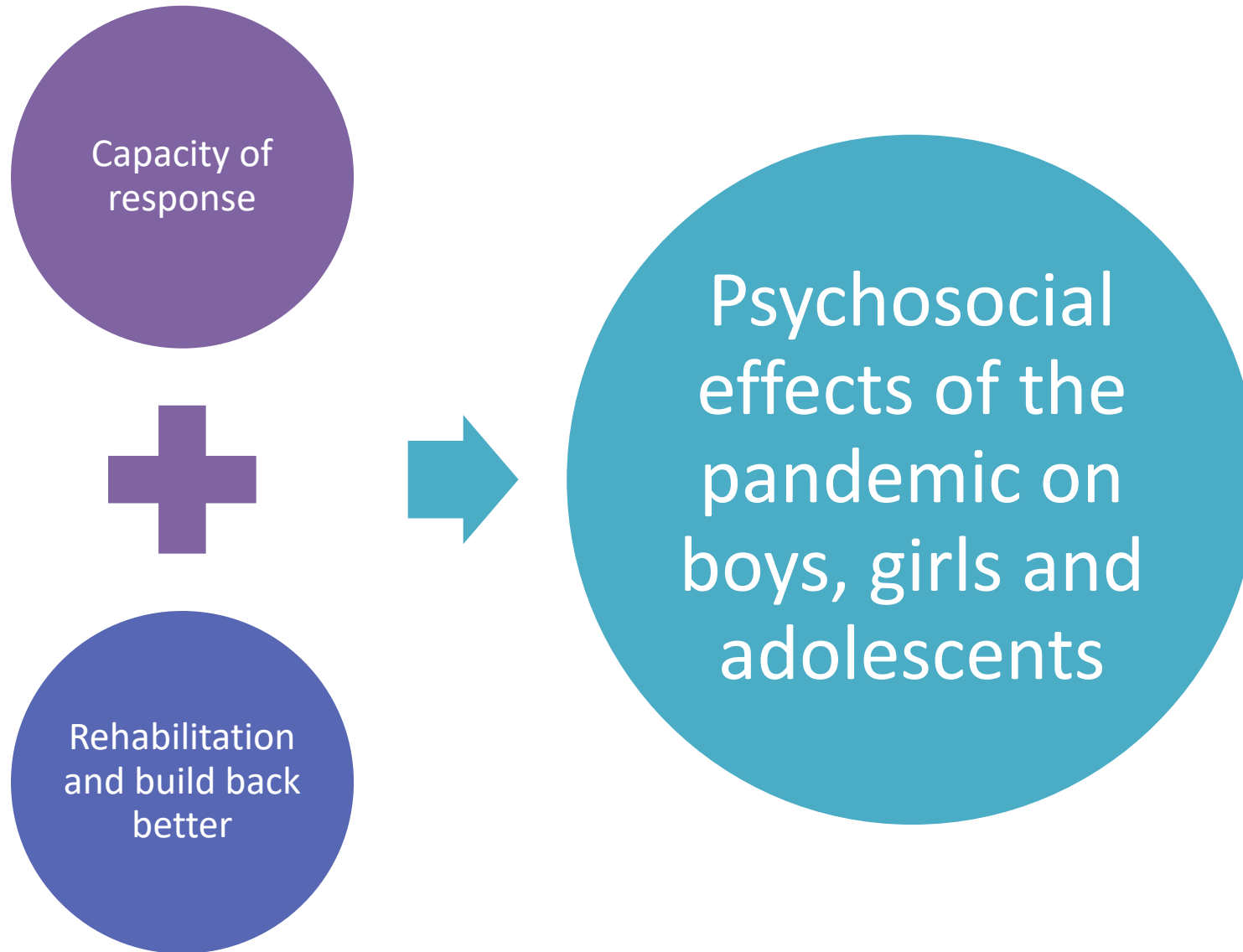

# Objective

The project's objective is to improve the response, rehabilitation and build back better capacity of APEC member economies' educational communities when faced to the psychosocial effects of the pandemic on boys, girls and adolescents, through the implementation of a workshop on DRM with a Child Rights Approach and a focus on the rehabilitation of the psychosocial effects of the pandemic, which can then be replicated by the attendees. 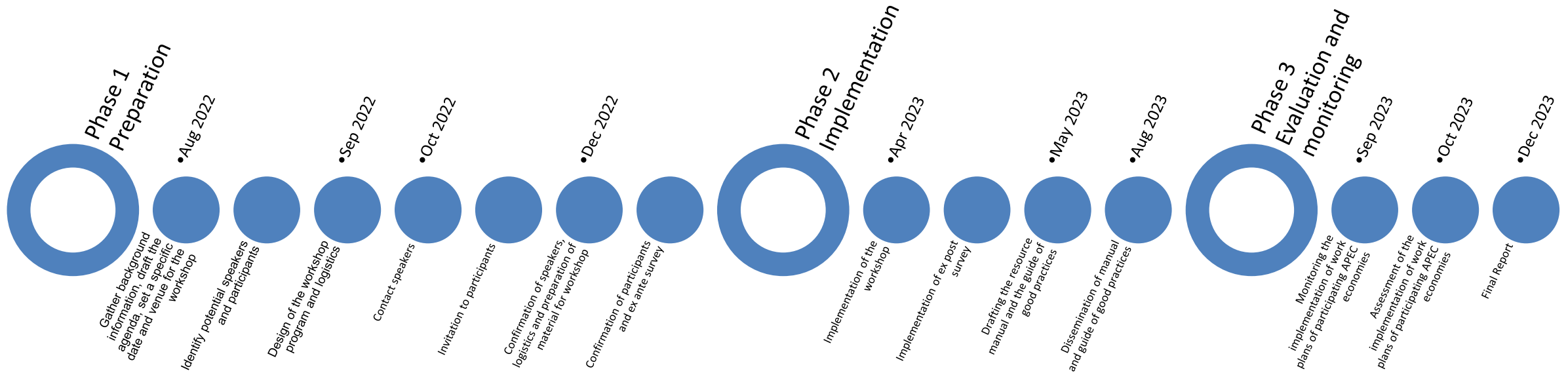




# Methodology
